

Notes from Meeting 26th September 2018 7.30pm Maybury Centre, Woking

1) Welcome and introductions by the Secretary, Paul Couchman, with a request to sign in.

4) **Treasurers Report** – Treasurer was not present but written report circulated. We have around \pounds 780 in the bank at present.

5) **Truth About Zane** (TAZ). Liz Mansfield updated the meeting on the latest in the campaign for truth and justice for the family of Zane Gbangbola. A Campaign Committee is being established with representatives from political parties, trade unions and community campaigns.

6) **Guest speakers,** Lee Belsten from Surrey Fire Brigades Union (FBU) and Paul Thompson from the Railworkers Union (RMT), addressed the meeting regarding the dire situation in the Surrey Fire Service, the social media war and the RMT strikes over keeping a Guard on the Trains on SWR. Guest speaker Rob Williams from the National Shop Stewards Network (NSSN) then spoke from a national perspective and a good discussion followed.

7) What can we do?

Paul Couchman introduced a discussion on what we can do as SOSiS, as trade unions and as individuals. After discussion, consensus was arrived at the FBU leading the call for a major event in Woking on 15th December. All agreed to take the date back to our respective organisations, political parties, trade unions and tenants associations and prepare for a show of public support for public services. It was agreed that there would be a bulleted list of specific cuts and corresponding demands related to actual services and the cuts in each sector – under the broad themes of:

- No to Austerity
- Yes to Public Safety
- For Fully Funded Public Services
- For a General Election Now!
